3. PUBLIC HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Strict compliance with the provisions of the following health related legislation and regulations are maintained :

- The International Health Regulations (2005) of World Health Organisation
- Infectious Disease Act (Chapter 204), 2020 (amendment) and
- Infectious Disease and Quarantine Regulations, 2010.

3.2 The Pilot-in-Command of an aircraft landing at Brunei International Airport shall provide the Airport Health Officer/staffs with one copy of the Passengers manifest and one copy of the General Declaration signed by the pilot-in-command.

3.3 Yellow Fever, Cholera, Plague, Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) , Ebola fever and other infectious diseases of public health concern may be subject to the following preventive measures: -

3.3.1 YELLOW FEVER

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required for travelers over one year of age coming from infected areas or has passed through partly or wholly endemic areas within the preceding 6 days. Failure to produce a vaccination certificate may cause the traveller to be denied entry or subject to medical inspection and/or medical surveillance.

3.3.2 CHOLERA, PLAGUE, SEVERE ACUTE RESPIRATORY SYNDROME (SARS) , EBOLA FEVER AND OTHER INFECTIOUS DISEASES OF PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERN

Passengers arriving by air from Cholera, Plague, Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) , Ebola fever and other infectious diseases of public health concern from affected areas may be subject to medical inspection and/or medical surveillance.

NOTE:

- 1) The validity period of international certificate of vaccination against yellow fever is 10 years, beginning 10 days after the date of vaccination or in the event of a revaccination within such period of ten years, from the date of that revaccination.
- 2) Brunei Darussalam is free from Malaria.

3.4 MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS

The Health Authority may, when necessary, medically examine any person before his departure or on arrival an international voyage.

3.5 DISINSECTATION

All aircraft arriving in Brunei Darussalam are required to be disinfected before landing by any of the following means as recommended by World Health Organisation:

Places	Method	Application
<i>Pre-flight</i>	The spray applied before the passengers board the aircraft but not more than 1 hour before the doors are closed.	A 2% (20g/kg) permethrin cis:trans (25.75) formulation is currently recommended for this application.
<i>Blocks away</i>	Aerosol spraying of the passenger cabin after the doors have been locked following embarkation but before take-off.	An aerosol 2% (20g/kg) D-phenothrin and should be applied at a rate of 35g of formulation per 100m ³
<i>Top of Descent</i>	An inflight spraying carried out as the aircraft starts its descent to the arrival airport.	An aerosol 2% (20g/kg) D-phenothrin and should be applied at a rate of 35g of formulation per 100m ³ .
<i>Residual Spraying</i>	The regular application of a residual insecticide to internal surfaces of the aircraft, except in food preparation areas, at intervals based on the duration of effectiveness.	A permethrin cis:trans (25.75) formulation is currently recommended for this application.

3.6 LANDING OF CORPSE OR HUMAN REMAINS

Corpse or human remains or bones shall be accompanied by a medical certificate or other satisfactory evidence showing the name of the deceased, the date and cause of death and means adopted to preserve the body.
